
All children are welcome to learn about Jesus Christ each week at 9:15 a.m.


PRAYER WARRIOR CELEBRATION BREAKFAST: FEBRUARY 12

WORSHIP AT WESTMINSTER: WINTER/SPRING 2023: "THE LITTLE EPISTLE OF JOY"



During worship until Palm Sunday, Westminster will be embarking on an excursion through Paul's letter to the church at Philippi, otherwise known as the Book of Philippians, and commonly called "the little epistle of joy."

According to Acts 16, after having been prevented from preaching in Asia Minor and subsequently called to the region of Macedonia in a vision, Paul, along with Silas, Timothy, and Luke, set sail for what is modern-day Greece. Travelling to Philippi, an important Roman outpost, they founded the church there—the first in Europe. Among the early converts were a number of women, including Euodia, Syntyche, and Lydia, the baptism of whom and of her whole household, provide, in part, the biblical underpinning for baptism of believers' infants and children. Other early Philippian church members were the jailer that held Paul and Silas during their time in the city, along with Clement, who at various points in church history has been, disputedly, assumed to be the fourth bishop of Rome and author of I Clement, one of the earliest Christian writings outside the New Testament.

Traditionally, it was understood that Paul wrote his letter to the Philippians from his place of imprisonment in Rome sometime toward the latter end of the decade

following his establishment of the church. During that time, the Philippian church, in particular, had been generous in providing spiritual and material support to Paul, especially during his various imprisonments and other difficulties. On a general front, though, some nascent Christian churches, notably the one at Galatia, were struggling internally with competing cultural and religious factions. Among these were tension caused by the relative wealth of the Gentile congregations to the relative poverty of the Jewish congregations, particularly at Jerusalem. Churches were also visited by various preachers who taught that Gentile converts to Christianity must first undergo the ceremonial Jewish rites, such as circumcision, before becoming part of the faith. As Paul notes in part in Philippians, and very directly in Galatians, this position was diametrically at odds with the gospel of salvation in Christ by grace and faith alone, and therefore robbed the Gospel of its power.

Undoubtedly these sorts of struggles, along with others' petty jealousy of Paul's missionary successes, and ordinary personality clashes, were headed for the Philippians, who had been so faithful and persistent in their mission. To head these things off, Paul's wrote his letter of encouragement to the church that had brought him such joy.

Westminster's exploration of this joy-filled epistle, with its enduring exhortations to Christians and ageless wisdom and encouragement, will follow this outline:

Week One: Philippians 1:1-11. Paul's offers thanksgiving and prayers for the faithful Philippian church.

Week Two: Philippians 1:12-18. Paul's suffering has advanced the cause of Christ.

Week Three: Philippians 1:18-26. The greatest joy, even in the face of death, is in Christ's gift of salvation.

Week Four: Philippians 1:27-2:4. Christian joy is meant to be lived out in holiness.

Week Five: Philippians 2:1-11. *Jesus is the preeminent example of humility, perseverance, and joy.*

Week Six: Philippians 2:12-18. Christians, by their conduct, are meant to be as lights to the world.

Week Seven: Philippians 2:19-30. Timothy and Epaphroditus are examples of service to Christ and the church.

Week Eight: Philippians 3:1-11. The greatest identity one may ever have in life is "Christian."

Week Nine: Philippians 3:12-4:1. Paul encourages the church toward faithfulness even in the face of struggle and persecution.

Week Ten: Philippians 4:2-9. Joy and peace, inside and outside, come from minds united around what is good and honorable.

Week Eleven: Philippians 4:10-23. A closing thank you note and blessing.

The series will conclude the Sunday before Palm Sunday.

CONFESSING OUR FAITH: A NEW SUNDAY SCHOOL CLASS COMING IN FEBRUARY

Is it enough to "just love Jesus?"

Are all churches and religions more or less the same?

Is the Christian faith just another sociological or psychological phenomenon?

All of these are legitimate questions for Christians to consider: But to begin, a Christian must have a basic understanding of the content of "the faith once imparted to the saints." From that point, a Christian can—and should!—dive more deeply into how this imparted faith fits with his or her own convictions, how it squares with other religions, and what it means for the world at large.

Starting February 19, Pastor Will will begin a second adult and older youth Sunday School class that will spend the better part of 2023 exploring The Westminster Confession of Faith, which is the most classic statement of Presbyterian beliefs. This class will begin by exploring the basic tenets of the Reformed theological tradition, and from there move into discussion about how these articles of faith challenge or affirm us and how they compare to other Christian traditions.

For those youth interested in confessing their own faith in 2023—that is, making a public profession of faith in Christ and becoming a covenantal member of the Westminster family of faith—this class will provide for them basic doctrinal content, which will then be discussed very practically during confirmation meetings before LifeHouse youth group gatherings throughout the year. Children's Sunday School classes will also introduce, in addition to their usual content, coordinate questions from The Shorter Catechism, which will provide for points of discussion between parents who choose to participate in this class and their children who attend Sunday School.

The Confessing Our Faith class will begin alongside the Adult Sunday School class on February 19 at 9:15 a.m.

GULFPORT: CITY OF LIGHT PRAYER GATHERINGS

Local church leaders along with the Coast Ecumenical Fellowship came together at Westminster on December 13 for City Council Ward IV's City of Light Prayer Gathering. 
