ORGAN UPDATE: Westminster extends its sincere thanks to the Magnolia Presbyterian Church (EPC) in Magnolia, Mississippi for



giving us a temporary organ to use in worship while

Westminster's pipe organ is being repaired. Jeanie Pollard, LeAnn Davis, Pete Bloss, Scott Winter, Will Shurley, Chip Westbrook, and Louis Congleton all traveled at various times to Magnolia to see the instrument and secure it for travel. Scott Winter even used his technical skill to make adjustments to the instrument so it would be ready for use by Easter.

Westminster's insurance company has sent an adjustor, who is also a certified organ technician, to look at the pipe organ. Currently, he is submitting his evaluation and recommendations to the insurance company for full repairs. In the meantime, he was able to stabilize two divisions, i.e. one manual, or keyboard, and the pedal board, so that approximately 2/3 of the instrument are playable. Updates on the electrical repairs and associated costs will be forthcoming.

HOME COMMUNION AND COMMUNION AT SUMMERFIELD: Westminster is a community of faith that gathers to worship the risen Lord, to hear his Word, and to partake of his sacraments. Gathering for worship is the most basic right and responsibility of church membership: Neglecting to meet together does harm to the spiritual growth of the individual and also to the spiritual health of the church body overall.

However, the session knows well there are members of our church who by virtue of health or other condition simply cannot leave their homes or gather in a crowd; otherwise, they would joyfully be part of the worshipping body. For those members, the session has long authorized home delivery of the communion elements by the pastor and a ruling elder. This home communion service is an extension of the Lord's Table around which the congregation has gathered for worship: A ruling elder is required to join the pastor in home communion, in fact, as he or she functions as a representative of the gathered congregation.

The session recognizes beloved members of this church have been confined to their homes and have missed the simple joys of going to restaurants, making grocery trips, and living life as we know it. We want to make sure the experience of God's love and grace as signified by the sacrament of the Lord's Supper is not something that must be missed. Providing for communion with God and one another is among the session's greatest joys and responsibilities.

Westminster continues to host a brief communion service at Summerfield Senior Living each month on the third Thursday at 2 p.m. Westminster members and friends are welcome to attend and to visit with Summerfield residents.

If you have been unable to leave your home, and would like to receive Communion, please let Pastor Will or any elder know: We will be happy to arrange it for you.
