PULPIT SUPPLY UPDATE FROM CHIP WESTBROOK, CLERK OF SESSION AND SCOTT WINTER, WORSHIP COMMITTEE CHAIR

It is with great joy and anticipation that we announce the arrival of our Interim Pastor, Doctor Rhett G. Payne, III, who will be joining us during this time of transition. We are confident that Reverend Payne's experience and leadership will guide us as we continue to grow and serve together. Rhett, a native of Jackson, AL, did his undergraduate work at Oral Roberts University. Rhett received a Bachelor of Arts degree in English Bible from Oral Roberts University in 1977. From there, he received two master's degrees from Covenant Theological Seminary, St. Louis, MO – a Master of Arts in Biblical Studies in 1981 and a Master of Divinity in 1985. Finally, Rhett received the Doctor of Ministry degree from Reformed Theological Seminary in Orlando, FL, in 1995. Rhett began in student ministry, serving four different churches over eleven years. The last of the four was the Central Presbyterian Church of St. Louis, MO. He co-founded EPC youth ministry (now "Student Ministries") in the late '80s. Rhett began his pastoral ministry as a church planter in Marshall, TX, serving as the founding pastor of EPC of Marshall, from 1985 until 1991. In 1991, he moved to Dallas, TX, to take over a "stalled" church plant, which at the time was called "Grace Church." Rhett served as the reorganizing pastor of Grace Church, which later changed its name to CrossPointe Community Church, from 1991 until 2002. In the summer of 2002, Rhett became the pastor of the First Presbyterian Church of Meridian, MS, where he served until his retirement in April of 2025. Rhett has served in both the Presbytery of the Central South and now the Presbytery of the Gulf South for his entire pastoral



ministry. He has chaired both the Nominating Committee and the New Church Development Committee, as well as the Church Health Committee. And in 2006, he served as the Moderator of the Central South Presbytery. Rhett and his wife, Donna, have been married for 50 years as of May 17. They have three adult children, five grandchildren, and one great granddaughter. Rhett & Donna will begin their ministry with us on Father's Day.

LIFEHOUSE YOUTH UPDATE FROM DIRECTOR OF YOUTH, ALICE BELLANGER:



The Adult class, led by Elder Ted Hammer, is beginning their new book study by Dietrich Bonhoeffer: "Life Together."

Description: Famed Lutheran pastor

Dietrich Bonhoeffer's Life Together is a bold and daring look at Christian life, and what cross-centered living can look like for all believers.

Renowned for his thoughts on Christianity's role in the secular world,
Bonhoeffer, also the author of bestselling The Cost of Discipleship,
allows readers to deepen their faith and fellowship through actionable steps towards building lasting and meaningful communities.

In Life Together, Bonhoeffer, famous for his involvement in a plot to overthrow Adolph Hitler, recounts his unique fellowship in an underground seminary during the Nazi years in Germany. Through this one-of-a-kind lived experience, he compassionately yet challengingly defines what living in a community is all about, and the divine importance of it.

In five brief, yet rich, chapters, Bonhoeffer enlightens us on:

- How to build a meaningful community, through both mutual affection for Christ and for each other
- The fundamental elements of community, including prayer, worship, and service, but also listening, comforting, and confessing sins to one another
- How love permeates every aspect of community—love for God, one another, and the beauty of connection
- The role that loneliness and uncertainty play in finding community and answering God's call

Practical yet profound, this book remains the most influential and modern book on the nature and spirit of authentic Christian community. It reveals the communal Christian spirit that inspired Bonhoeffer and his Christian associates to conspire to assassinate Hitler as an act of true Christian love and courage. Life Together is bread for all who are hungry for the real life of Christian fellowship.
